Sunday 3 **Trinity 3** 10.30 am Mass
 5.30 pm *Asperges* and Sung Mass

Thursday 7 SS. Cyril & Methodius 12.45 pm Mass

Brothers born in Greece in the 9th century who became hugely effective missionaries to the Slavic peoples of eastern Europe. Their intercession is particularly invoked for the cause of Christian unity. The 'Cyrillic' alphabet used in modern Russia developed from one invented by the brothers.

Thursday 4 S. John Vianney 12.45 pm Mass

He was the Curé [parish priest] of Ars (a tiny village in the Saône Valley north of Lyon), France, from 1818 to his death in 1859. Not bright, he only just scraped through the ordination examinations and was sent to the most obscure parish his bishop could find. He here exercised a ministry of spiritual direction which became famous across Europe. He is known as the patron saint of parish priests

Thursday 11 S. Clare of Assisi 12.45 pm Mass

One of the first followers of S. Francis of Assisi and founder of the Order of S. Clare (the 'Poor Clares'), sharing Francis's theology of joyous poverty in imitation of Christ. She died in 1253

Monday 15 **Assumption of the BVM** 7.30 pm High Mass, Procession & Benediction

This is the Principle Feast of The Blessed Virgin Mary, and it was around this time in 1421, with the court of Henry V in York, that Emma Roughton, anchoress of All Saints North Street, had the best documented of all English Visions. **A glass of wine will be provided after Mass by one of the Churchwardens.**

Thursday 1 S. Giles 12.45 pm Mass

An 8th-century Greek who became a hermit in France. He insisted on living outside the walls of the nearest town, and as a cripple he exercised a notable ministry among disabled beggars and lepers. As a result many churches dedicated to S. Giles are just outside the walls of towns (York's was in Gillygate = S. Giles's Street)

Thursday 8 **Nativity of the BVM** 7.30 pm Sung Mass

This festival began in 5th-century Jerusalem at the Basilica of Holy Mary's Birthplace. It comes 9 months after the Feast of her Conception.

Sunday 11 **Trinity 13** 5.30 pm Sung Mass

Thursday 15 Our Lady of Sorrows 12.45 pm Mass

This feast, also known as 'S. Mary at the Cross', commemorates the suffering humanity of Our Lady. It draws attention to her 'seven sorrows': Simeon's prophecy of the sword, the flight into Egypt, the loss of her Child in the temple, her meeting her Son on the Way of the Cross, her standing next to the Cross as he dies, her receiving his dead body from the cross, and her seeing him placed in the tomb.

Originally the feast of S. Michael the Archangel, the day of dedication of the Roman Basilica of S. Michael. Abp Cranmer added 'and all Angels' in the BCP, and the Roman revisers of 1969 added 'and SS. Gabriel and Raphael'.
